



JUNIOR STOCKMAN'S LIVESTOCK SHOW 2022

FEMALE SHOW

1. Females will be shown by breed in 3 Divisions – heifer calf, yearling heifer & cow/calf pair

Division 1 2022 Heifer calf (born Jan 1, 2022 or later) (May also be shown with cow in Division 3)

Division 2 2021 Yearling Heifer (born Jan 1, 2021 – Dec 31, 2021)

Division 3 Cow with natural calf at side

Class A – Cow born Jan 1, 2020, with her own natural 2022 calf at side (either sex)

Class B – Cow born prior to Dec 31, 2019, with her own natural 2022 calf at side (either sex)

Class A and class B winners will compete for Division winner

“If a heifer calf advances to the Breed Championship from both Division 1 and Division 3, it MUST be shown with the cow in Division 3.”

Winner of each Division competes for Breed Championship.

Winner of each Breed Champion compete for Overall Grand Champion Female

2. Breeds will show in alphabetical order.
3. Entries in each division will be shown by age of animal, youngest to oldest.
4. Breed must be stated on entry form (ie: Black Angus, Red Angus, Charolais, Horned Hereford, Polled Hereford, Simmental, Commercial, etc.), with breed association registration papers accompanying purebred entries.
5. All purebred animals, including calf at side, must be registered with their breed association prior to the show and registration number(s) provided to office. Any purebred entries remaining unregistered or pending registration **one week** prior to the show will be moved to the Commercial class.
6. All animals that are not registered with a recognized breed association will be considered Commercial.
7. Black and Red Angus will be combined if there are less than 5 entries for one color.
8. Horned and Polled Hereford will be combined if less than 5 entries for either Horned or Polled.
9. If there are less than 5 entries in any breed, they will be shown in Other Breeds.
10. Divisions will be divided into more splits if there are more than 8 entries per division. Class winners will compete for Division Champion.
11. Substitutions are allowed with the approval of the Show Committee, given that details on the new animal are provided more than **one week** prior to the show.
12. Maximum 3 entries per exhibitor. Exceptions may be made at the discretion of the Show Committee if a Division 3 entry includes a calf to also be shown in Division 1.
13. Additional entries by an exhibitor will be charged double after the entry deadline.

ENTRY FEES

Female Show \$65.00 per entry (Each exhibitor is limited to 3 entries)

Enviro fee for stalling \$15.00 per entry (Cow/Calf pair is considered one animal)

Entering a heifer calf in both Division 1 and Division 3 will result in 2 entry fees and 1 enviro fee for that animal.

SHOWMANSHIP DIVISION

1. Each exhibitor is automatically entered.
2. Non-Livestock entry fee \$45.00 (must borrow an animal from an exhibitor).
3. Exhibitors will show from youngest to oldest. Age categories as of December 31, 2021:

Peewee	6 to 8 years
Junior	9 to 12 years
Intermediate	13 to 15 years
Senior	16 to 21 years

PROSPECT STEER PEN COMPETITION

1. Limited to two entries per exhibitor.
2. Entries to consist of a prospect 4-H or show steer in a pen with or without its mother (pen will be provided).
3. Steers maybe clipped prior to the show, but no clipping or fitting of the steers will be allowed at the show.
4. A short seminar on selecting prospect steers will be conducted prior to judging. Attendance is mandatory for juniors entered in female show and showmanship.
5. Steer exhibitors are encouraged to offer their steers for private treaty sale as prospect and 4-H projects.

Juniors may also enter the Cattle Pen Show held at Ranchman's Ridin' & Recitin' on the same day as the Junior Stockman's Livestock Show. Contact Grant Scheirlinck (306-741-8398) for more information.

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. This is a FAMILY EVENT. The objective is to work together as a family and help your children when necessary. WE STRONGLY ENCOURAGE only juniors doing the grooming/fitting of their animals. If they need help, by all means help them, but we discourage adults doing everything for them. This event is a learning opportunity for youth.
2. Only Juniors who are entered in the show will be allowed in the showing to assist in leading an animal. Absolutely no parents or non-exhibitors may assist an exhibitor in the showing. If you need assistance
3. The Swift Current Ag & Ex and the Junior Stockman's Committee are not responsible for any accident, injury or damage suffered to person or property while at the show and grounds. Exhibitors and their animals enter the show at their own risk.
4. Though most COVID-19 restrictions are now lifted, we remain committed to delivering you a safe and comfortable experience. As always, the safety and health of our staff, volunteers, participants, and partners remains our top priority. We will continue to adhere to the Government of Saskatchewan's Public Health Guidelines. We would like to thank everyone for their cooperation
5. All livestock on the grounds must have a CCIA tag.
6. Show is open to ages 6 to 21, as of December 31, 2021.
7. Purebred papers and tattoos may be checked at the discretion of the Show Committee.
8. No animals with ringworm or any other contagious diseases will be allowed on the grounds.
9. Wood chips will be initially provided.
10. Electrical outlets are limited; if you require extra power please bring a generator.
11. All exhibitors must wear a show harness displaying their show number on their back.
12. All participants must wear appropriate footwear when dealing with livestock.
13. No tampering or altering livestock in any way will be tolerated.
14. Purebred classes will follow breed specific rules.

15. The show is open to all, but the committee reserves the right to refuse an entry.
16. A maximum of 150 total animal entries will be accepted for the show.
17. You must provide your own bedding for tie outs.
18. All livestock will be released after show is finished.
19. Purebred Female Show animals must be owned by the youth exhibitor OR an immediate family OR the family's farm corporation prior to the show; however, the youth exhibitor must be named on the entry. In the Showmanship Division, Exhibitors may use any animal entered in the Female Show, regardless of ownership.
20. The Show Committee has the authority to determine if the rules are being adhered to and deal with any violations, protests or complaints at their discretion.

CODE OF CONDUCT

By entering the Junior Stockman's Livestock Show, Exhibitors and their attending parents/guardians agree to adhere to the following Code of Conduct before, during, and after the show:

1. To treat all exhibitors, volunteers, staff, spectators, and judges with respect, courtesy, and cooperation;
2. To demonstrate good faith and sportsman-like conduct;
3. To provide the Show Committee with only truthful information on all entry forms;
4. To provide proper care for their animal(s) while at the show;
5. To not interfere or tamper with any other exhibitor's animals;
6. To not unethically fit any animal by way of any treatment or operation materially altering the structure or the natural conformation of any part of the animal's body;
7. To not purposefully damage the property of the Swift Current Agricultural & Exhibition Association, the City of Swift Current, or any other exhibitor; and
8. To follow all rules and guidelines as set out by the Show Committee.

It is at the discretion of the Show Committee to determine if the Code of Conduct is being observed by each Exhibitor and attending parent/guardian, and the Show Committee reserves the right to issue written and/or verbal warnings to Exhibitors who are found to be noncompliant. In extreme cases, the Show Committee also reserves the right to administer temporary or permanent bans from participation in future Junior Stockman's shows.
